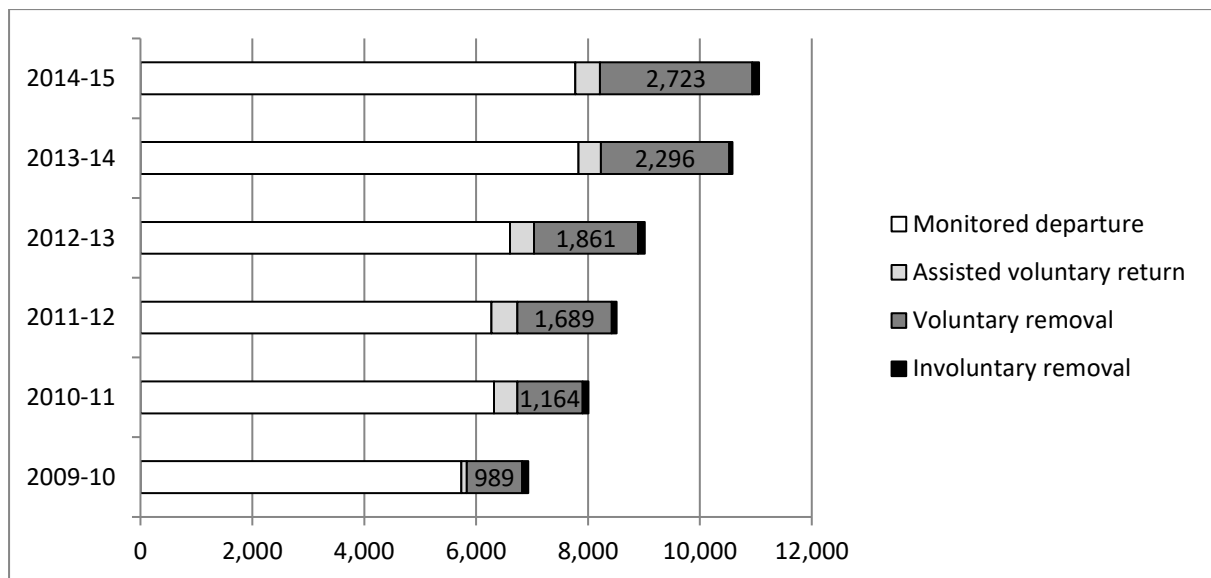

TOTAL COMPLIANCE RELATED RETURNS AND REMOVALS BY DEPARTURE TYPE

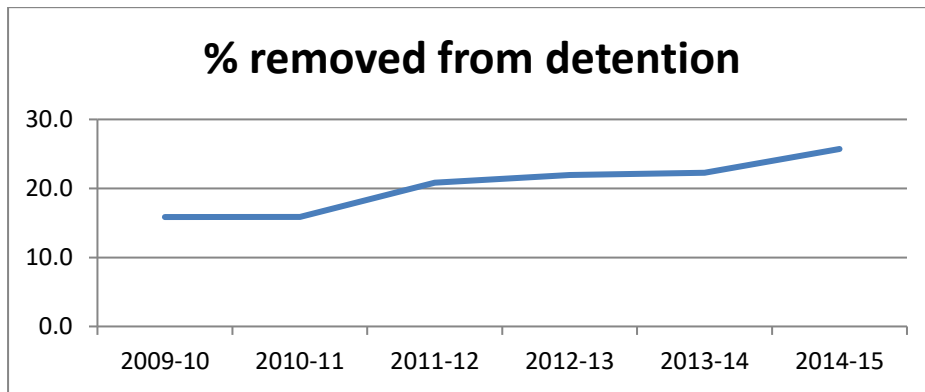

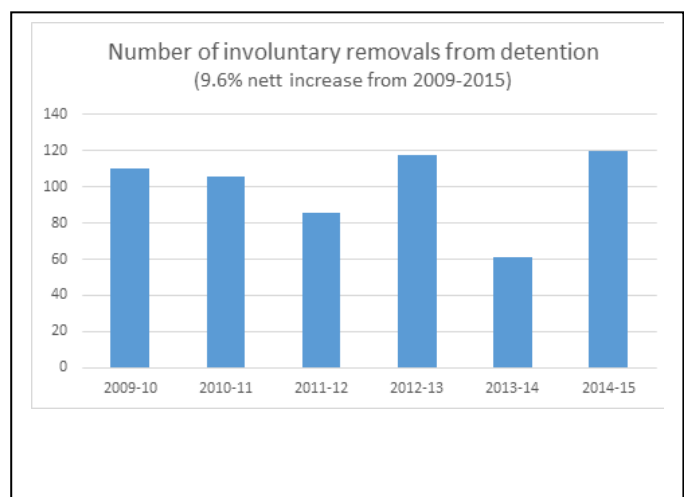

Monitored departures accounted for the majority of all departures. Assisted voluntary returns have been relatively stable since 2010-11. So-called voluntary returns from detention have grown steadily over the reported time period.



The proportion of removals occurring from detention has been steadily increasing.
